which provides emotional support for children suffering from homelessness and trauma. While in Spokane, she has been involved in a variety of social justice ministries, both at the parish and in the Spokane community. At the parish, Sr. Pat has served on the Immigration Committee, the Caring for Creation Committee, as a facilitator for JustFilms, but most know her best as a lector -- at the Saturday, 5:00 Mass and at holy day celebrations.

Six parishioners recently visited our Sister Community in the Bajo Lempa region of El Salvador. Each one will share a reflection of their experiences.

In the midst of our pilgrimage to El Salvador and our immersion into the injustices and corruption present, it was a wonderful reprieve to hear of the scholarship program (Beca) initiated and administered through the Sisters of Providence, several of whom live in the small communities.

The scholarship program is donor funded. The Sisters include regular formation classes on personal development, as well as social and



political issues. We attended the Sunday liturgy that celebrated the start of a new semester. We gathered outdoors with more than 90 students and their families, who benefit from the scholarships. The presentation of the gifts was very moving, as individual students came

forward holding aloft a backpack, a notebook, a living plant, and finally a basket containing their scholarship letters. At the end of the mass, the students were individually called forward to receive their scholarships. Several spoke of their experience and their gratitude for the opportunity to attend either high school, a technical school, or university with their scholarship money.

Following Mass, a number of students spoke to us, trying out their English, and expressing gratitude for our presence. Of course, the event was followed by a delicious meal, with help from many of the students.

In the midst of challenges in El Salvador, the scholarship program is a concrete way to help bring about change. I was grateful to hear, see, and celebrate what the Sisters of Providence are accomplishing, and to understand better how donations can make a difference, no matter how small.
