Reflections from El Salvador




Six parishioners recently visited our Sister Community in the Bajo Lempa region of El Salvador. Each delegate will share a reflection of their experiences.

Broken Families Clinging to Hope

Every delegation visit to El Salvador has included a stop at the Center for Exchange and Solidarity, or CIS, a nonprofit that monitors elections, provides scholarships to students and supports projects that empower underserved communities. Recently they have provided legal help for individuals wrongfully swept up in a mass imprisonment of gang members, known as the "State of Exception."

Leslie Schuld, the director of CIS, spent time with our delegation to explain the effects this overreach has had on just one community that CIS serves. This remote community has little to no gang activity, yet has been a target of President Bukele's anti-gang campaign that has imprisoned about 70,000 Salvadorans since March 2022. This "State of Exception" refers to the suspension of civil rights for those arrested. By acting quickly to provide documents of one man's innocence and his serious medical condition, CIS was fortunate to facilitate his freedom. However, his release is a rarity.



We sat with 4 families from our sister community that have sons wrongfully imprisoned for nearly two years. We listened to their struggles to free them. From half a world away, it may seem like there's little we can do. But I have contacted my representatives in Congress to send a message

to President Bukele, urging him to respect the civil rights of those incarcerated. I encourage you to prayerfully consider this action, as well.
