<u>17th Parish Delegation</u> <u>to El Salvador,</u> January 11 – 20, 2024

Six parishioners leave for El Salvador this Thursday, Jan. 11th. They will visit members of our Sister Community in the Bajo Lempa region of El Salvador. During their stay, each day is filled with a variety of visits including: the Normandia Farm Cooperative, homes in Angela Montano, the Sisters in Nueva Esperanza, Liturgy of the Word in La Noria, La Quesera Martyr site, and Providence Scholarship students in La Papalota.

In and around San Salvador, the group visits include: the site where the Four North American Women were killed, St. Oscar Romero memorials, the Wall which lists the names of those killed and disappeared during the 12-year-war, the University of San Salvador where the 6 Jesuits and the two women were killed in 1989.

Their time away is both informative and a pilgrimage. It is a walk in solidarity with Salvadorans who have been oppressed, but who continue to move forward in faith and resilience. *Please hold the delegation and our Sister Community in prayer.*
