## Embracing a Sustainable and Spirit-filled Lifestyle for Advent/Christmas

The first Christmas took place in a very simple setting—a stable. As we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus, we are challenged to remember its humility and simplicity. The Caring for Creation Committee invites us to live simply and sustainably this season, to focus on what truly brings peace and joy on this feast of God-becoming-human.

### Reflection:

**"Tis a gift to be simple, 'tis a gift to be free."** These words express my Advent/Christmas desire for simplicity and joy. This Advent, I want to slow down, make more time for prayer and reflection, walk in the snow, observe the starry skies. I want to spend more sacred time with family and friends – over tea or a meal – rather than shopping and spending. My hope: to live more simply during this season of national busyness, freeing myself to prepare for the greatest of gifts—Emmanuel, God-with-us.

As Advent people, let us consider giving Christmas gifts that are more personal and sustainable. Coupons for shared experiences/activities (movie, theater, art gallery, basketball game) rather than a trip to the mall or an order from Amazon. Meaningful gifts that are handmade, locally grown, fairtrade or second-hand. The gift of time to help a neighbor or a low-income senior through Volunteer Chore (*Dec. 9th, see info in this bulletin.*) Maybe a gift to a local charity (*Catholic Charities*) or an international charity (*Heifer or Catholic Relief Services*). Yes, living a more sustainable Advent/Christmas is countercultural, but more gentle on our common home and, hopefully, more joy-filled.


